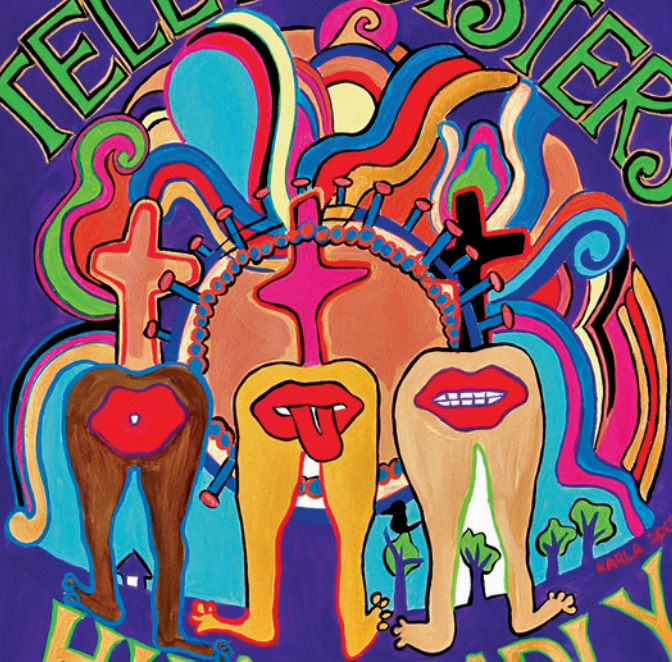

You can protect yourself and our community from HIV/AIDS by always using a condom and water-based lube for sex.

If you inject, always use your own new equipment; never share.

ACON promotes the health and wellbeing of NSW's gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender and sistergirl community (GLBT/S). We also provide information, support and advocacy for people living with HIV or at risk of acquiring HIV, including sex workers and people who use drugs.

We also provide referrals to ACON's many services including the HIV+ Women and Families Project, Needle and Syringe Project, Gay and Lesbian youth projects, Sex Workers' Outreach Project, Housing assistance, Counselling and much more.
